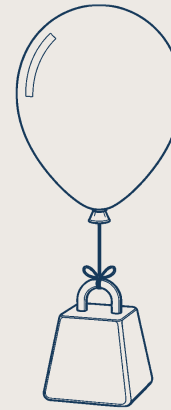

The threat to schools is not artificial intelligence. It is irrelevance.

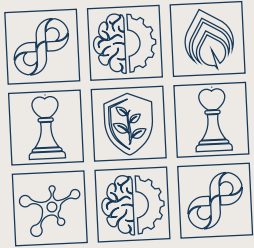

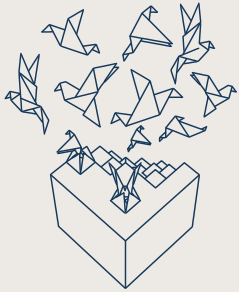

Schools should not create more dependency. They should create less.

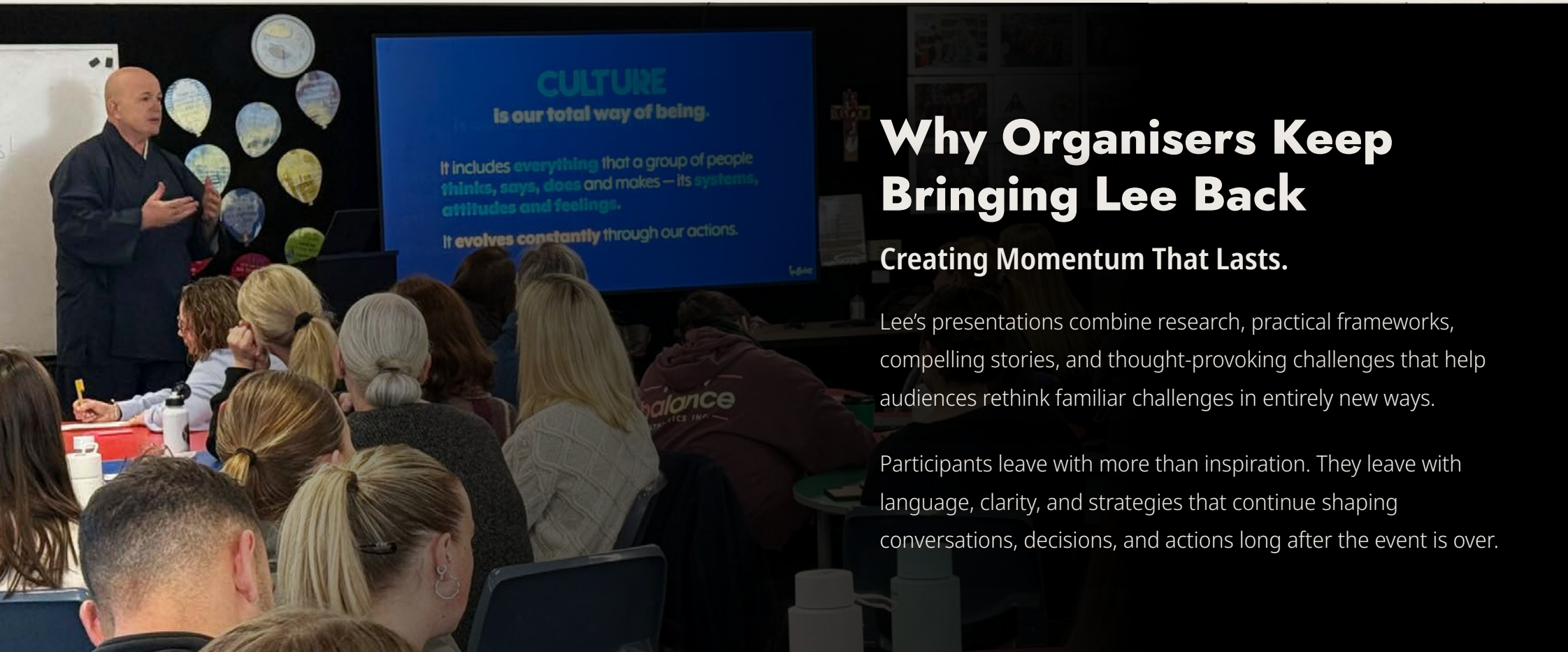
